

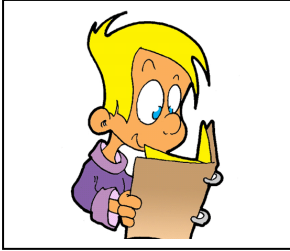
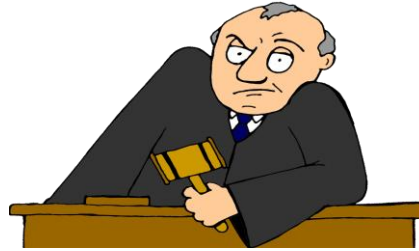
Analogies: Member to Group / Group to Member

The analogies in this lesson relate member to group (student to class) or group to member (team to player).

Give this sample analogy a try.

EXPLANATIONS: Is a symphony, an audience, or a concert a member of an orchestra? No. The answer has to be musician.

Remember that one word in each pair is a member; the other is a group. Be alert to word order!
