

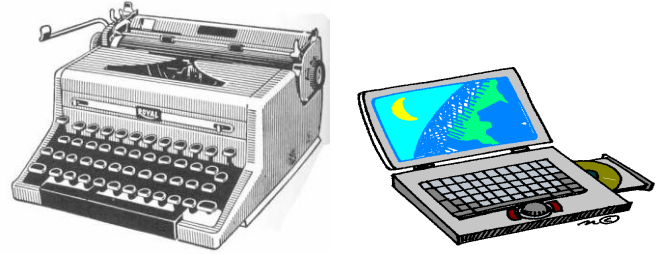
Analogies: Sequence
