Bag Some Babysitting Fun Directions

Directions: For the final project we will fill a “baby-sitters bag” during and outside of class. Grades will be determined by:

- **Responsibility Practices –**
 - Positive attitude and willingness to share ideas.
 - Completion of class activities and directions.
 - Doing your best.
 - After completing the required activities, extra choices were completed.
 - Due dates were met.
 - Written evaluations were correctly completed.
- **Respect-**
 - Students demonstrated character count behavior practices for others and the environment.
- **Safety-**
 - All choices were safe and age appropriate for the kids.
 - Students worked safely while completing tasks.



Part 2: Fun Times – Safety, Activities and Snacks . . .

Requirements-During class we will complete: a safety project, child’s activity, and snack. The completed project or directions will become part of your bag. (Grade: C - range)

EXTRA Bag Fun-

- Add items to the safety project. (See suggestions)
- Add children’s activities or ideas.
- Add nutritious snack ideas. (Grade: A or B – range)

Part 3: Organization and Presentation

Requirements-Complete all class labels for your bag. (Grade: C - range)

EXTRA Bag Fun-

- Your presentation is part of the over-all grade. So keep things safe, neat and fun for kids! Be organized! Add typed labels, graphics, stickers, etc. This helps you find things when needed – especially in case of emergencies.

Part 4: Student Written Evaluation:

Requirements- *Write a summary of your final project experience on another sheet of paper and attach to this scoring guide.* Include an introduction, description of what you added to this baby-sitting bag, a brief explanation stating if the selected items are safe and when you plan to use this bag and items. Finally, add a conclusion to your summary. This evaluation will be graded according to the following 6-Traits of Writing: Ideas and Conventions.

EXTRA Bag Fun-

- Type the summary on another sheet of paper and attach to this scoring guide.

Part 1: Bag

Requirements- Each student will be given a plastic bag to store activities. You will create a label for this bag. (Grade: C - range)

EXTRA Bag Fun-

- You may include a folder or notebook that will help organize class and your own ideas.
- You may choose to bring a durable storage bag from home to use as your baby-sitters bag. It may be decorated by you with fabric markers, paints, thread, etc.

(Grade: A or B – range)

Safety Project – Your # 1 responsibility is to keep the kids safe. So for our first activity we will work on some safety items for your babysitter’s bag.

Requirements-During class we will complete a safety project. The completed project or directions will become part of your bag. The safety project will include discussion and putting together a small first bag which contains 1 band aid, 1 pair of gloves, and a label to be places on the bag. This label will include a few community numbers. Students will then include 2-3 family emergency numbers on this label.
(Grade: C - range)

EXTRA Bag Fun-

- You may select a different first-aid kit for this activity. More items or labels may also be included. But be sure to keep the items safely stored and know how to use each item correctly and safely! Briefly answer each question for additions.

Play Dough Recipe:

Requirements-During class we will complete one play activity. The completed project and/ or directions will become part of your bag. As a group of 3-5 students you will mix up a recipe for play dough. The play dough will then be divided between each team member and placed in a small plastic bag with the recipe and a few personal comments written on the label for your next baby-sitting activity. Attach the label to the bag.

EXTRA Bag Fun-

Think about the kids that you babysit. What fun activities would they like? Select some activities or craft ideas and include them in your babysitter's. Add directions if needed. Be sure to select safe and ideas! Add other safe fun items to your bag – books, puzzles, videos, games, ect.

- Create puppets or games. Plan a puppet show.
- Copy off ideas from the web site. Organize ideas in a notebook.

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Snack Activities – Chances are you will be preparing foods for the kids to eat. Always check with parents about likes, dislikes, and any allergies the kids might have. Keep in mind that while preparing the food, you may need to select activities that will keep them entertained and give you time to prepare the foods. If old enough, the kids might help out with a few of the activities. But again remember **SAFETY!**
