

Finding Gross Pay

Mark's part-time job paid \$3.85 an hour. One week he worked 20 hours. Mark wanted to find his gross pay.

To find his gross pay, Mark multiplied the number of hours he worked (20) by his hourly pay (\$3.85).

$$\$3.85 \times 20 = \$77.00$$

Mark's gross pay was \$77 that week.

7. Martin worked 15 hours at Skateland. He earned \$3.17 an hour.
8. Dot worked 20 hours at the grocery store. She earned \$3.95 an hour.
