“It has made the vocabulary staff use when dealing with discipline issues consistent across the district which makes it easier to build on character attributes from year to year,” said Curriculum Director Jackie Nielsen, “I think Boys Town has helped us to increase student engagement.”

Two courses added to graduation requirements

The board approved adding quarter classes in Financial Literacy and Career Education to the high school graduation requirements.

Superintendent's Report

Pat Nauroth said the city of Beatrice will be doing some summer work on Orange Blvd., so the road will be closed for about two weeks. He also said a culvert at 26th and Lincoln will be replaced by the city in September or October. The street will be closed for two to three days. The bridge on south Highway 77 should be complete before the start of school.

Nauroth also said the administrators would be having a retreat for a half day on July 24 and 25.

Committee of the Whole

Vice-President Jon Zimmerman said the board heard a report by Curriculum Director Jackie Nielsen on the professional development plan for 2014-15. She also said the district will begin developing the calendars for 2015-16 and 2016-17 and at this time will review and evaluate the Professional Learning Community time.

The board also heard an update on summer projects from Business Manager John Brazell.

Action Agenda

The board gave first round approval to a number of items and also reaffirmed the

student fee policy. Handbooks for Classified Staff, Certified Staff and Substitutes were all approved.

Substitute pay was increased to \$118 a day. The milk bid from Prairie Land Dairy and the bread bid from Rotella's Italian Bakery were approved.

The fee for students to ride the bus that do not qualify for free busing was increased from \$115 to \$118.

The board approved the prices for breakfast and lunch prices. The price for a student breakfast will be \$1.85 and an adult breakfast will be \$2.05. The cost for an elementary student lunch will be \$2.60 and a middle and senior high lunch the cost will be \$2.70.

The September Board of Education meeting will be on Sept. 8 at 7 p.m. and the August Committee of the Whole meeting will be on August 28 at 7 p.m. Both meetings will be at the Central Administration Building.
