



## **Improving Instruction—Professional Development**

Designing quality instruction and providing appropriate activities for all students is not always easy. One way Beatrice Public Schools meet this challenge is through focused staff development to improve instruction and increase student achievement. District professional development stresses three areas:

Curriculum – what a student needs to know Instruction – how teachers present the curriculum to students

Teacher Evaluation – recognize staff achievement and support improvement



During the 2015/16 school year, we plan to implement a new evaluation tool that more accurately reflects the teaching / learning process. District staff will review their curriculum to ensure the rigorous demands of the newly adopted state standards are being met in all areas. The process to accomplish all of this is called Professional Development time which includes:

Full days – set aside for staff to work without students Wednesday early release – called Professional Learning Communities (PLCs)


Both avenues provide time for collaboration among staff members, communication to create consistency, evaluation of data, and exploration of best practices and interventions to implement in the classroom.


# **Elementary Facility Update**

The Board of Education is in the process of fact finding, considering our current facilities, figuring costs, and gathering input from the community.

In order to both maximize and control costs, the Board of Education chose to use a Construction Management at Risk (CM@R). This method brings the entire team (school – architect – construction manager) together early in the process so everyone is on the same page and giving input. The result is a guaranteed maximum price and fewer change orders in general.

The team of Caspers Construction and Sampson Construction was selected to fill the CM@R position based upon the following:

- They are highly qualified to provide the CM@R work and have done numerous projects of this scope
- Their recent work on the hospital demonstrates an ability to work jointly on a project and produce a high-quality product
- Their presentation showed a clear understanding of the issues associated with the project, its tie to the strategic plan, and a commitment to pre-bond work
- They have demonstrated the ability to involve local contractors in projects (i.e. 30% of the hospital construction involved local contractors), which is a high priority for the Board of Education
