To: Students, Parents/Guardians:

Students entering Nebraska schools from out-of-state may not enroll or schedule classes until they have presented a record of immunizations that meet these minimal standards:

- 3 D.P.T. (diphtheria/pertussis/tetanus)-one given on or after 4th birthday and an additional booster is needed before entering the 7th grade.
- 3 Polio
- 2MMR (measles/mumps/rubella)-given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month.
- 3 Hepatitis B
- 2 Varicella (Chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age or written documentation from the parent, guardian or health care provider with verification of the year in which the child had the disease will be accepted.

All students entering kindergarten or 7th grade, whether currently enrolled or new, must meet these standards also.

If the student's record is unavailable, they may call their former school and have their record dictated via phone or fax. If the student has not been immunized, he/she may return to register after they have received the required immunization, bringing written verification of such. (They will have 9 months to complete the rest of the Hepatitis B series). Arrangements to begin the needed immunizations may be made immediately by contacting Gage County Immunization Clinic (1216 S. 8th at 223-2366). The student must be accompanied by a parent/guardian - or bring a consent form signed by parent/guardian to receive the immunization at no charge. The only waivers acceptable under law are for specific medical reasons and must be signed by a physician or for specific religious beliefs, which must be notarized. Such waivers will be available from the registrar/secretary.
