- Achieving excellence is worth the investment of time, effort and resources.







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


OUR STUDENT POPULATION FOR 2014-2015


OUR ASSESSMENT RESULTS FOR 2014-2015






The primary purpose of the Beatrice Public School's comprehensive assessment system is to improve the academic achievement of each student in the district by organizing an assessment system that is aligned to state standards, district curriculum and school building goals. The assessment system provides accurate and timely information to all stakeholders for the purpose of improving student achievement and evaluating the district's overall performance. The focus on improving learning provides the basis for a student-centered accountability system.

Assessment, instruction, and learning are viewed as continuous and collaborative processes involving students, parents, school personnel and the community. The assessment system reflects the complex nature of learning and the important roles of school, home and society in the learning process. A balance of quantitative (assessments) and qualitative (teacher observations) indicators is essential to improve learning.



The Beatrice Public School District includes 4 elementary buildings, a middle school and a high school with PK-12 enrollment totaling just over 2,100.





Best Possible Summer

During the month of June, approximately 190 students per week participated in the summer experience at Paddock Lane Elementary. The Best Possible Summer learning experience provided hands-on, engaging activities while weaving in the core principles of reading, math, science, and writing to help students focus more on the application aspect of learning. Every week, students were able to choose a session which sparked their interests. The District partnered with the Beatrice YMCA, the Humane Society, the Homestead National Monument, UNL and Gage County Extension Offices, and Southeast Community College for support.

Enrichment (HAL) Program

District-wide, 173 students in grades 4-12 participated in activities during the 2014-2015 school year. At the elementary level, students enrichment activities included: literature groups, math and logic activities, field trips, and small group seminars on topics of their interest.

The goal of the Middle School program is to recognize each student's unique characteristics and create expanded learning experiences for each student. Some of the academic extensions options include: continental math league, math counts, quiz bowl, S.T.E.M. day, and the Patriot's pen writing contest.

At the high school level, students are invited to participate in honors classes offered by the English and Mathematics departments. Students in grades 10-12 have the opportunity to enroll in college level advanced placement classes. Academic competitions are available as well.

At all levels, classroom teachers, building coordinators, and other specialists strive to assess student potential and design options to enhance students' learning.




Early Childhood


Beatrice Community Preschool is a collaboration between Beatrice Public Schools and Blue Valley Community Action/Head Start to provide highquality developmentally appropriate, hands-on play based learning opportunity for all preschool children. During the 2014-2015 school year, over 150 children were served in an inclusive setting throughout 3 sections of preschool. Beatrice Community preschool offers a half day threeyear old and four-year old classes. Free in town transportation was started in January to help all students get to school. Through play, we are helping our littlest learners become wellrounded students ready for kindergarten.




